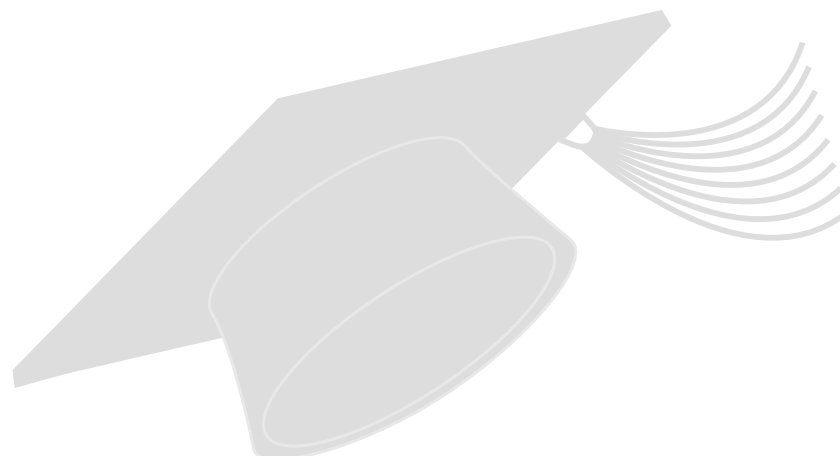
Edison Ballroom C From Start to Finish: Tips for Completing Your Dissertation [51346]

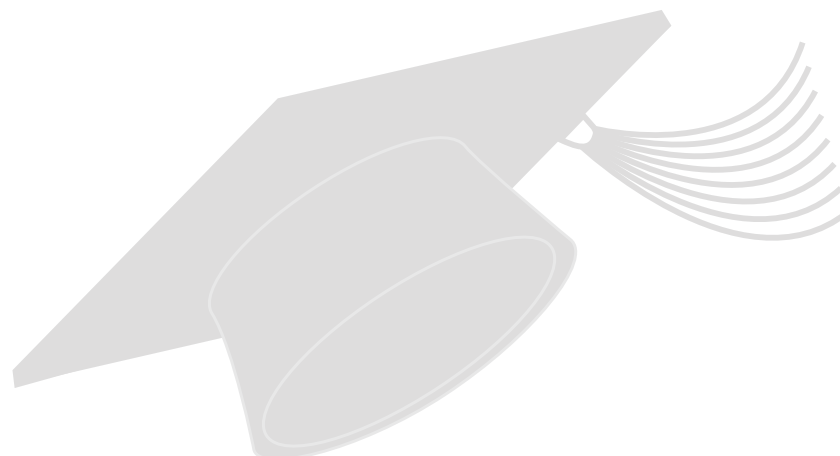
